

Garden Information

1

No. 2 Highway Cottage

What was originally a C16 dwelling with a small cottage garden, has been enlarged in recent years. This garden produces a rich variety of fruit and vegetables. Very much a working garden.

2

Old Brewery House

This very old garden extends to 3 acres. It is gradually being remodelled and includes herbaceous borders, roses, topiary, kitchen garden, wildlife pond and chickens.

Walbury

Third of an acre garden divided into three sections. Each section has a cottage garden atmosphere with different styles, packed with plants in colour-themed borders.

Warren Cottage

A pretty garden with views over the adjacent field. Recently the accent has been on planting for pollinators. This year there is a new pond which is already attracting wildlife.

Well Lane Corner

A half acre garden being developed from a tangle of conifer trees. Themed borders, roses, wildlife area, small orchard, beehives and amazing compost bins.

Day Cottage

A courtyard garden round a pretty C18 cottage opens into a wildflower meadow with views stretching beyond. Climbing roses, clematis and peonies. There are plenty of seats to sit and dream.

Aldersey House

This large garden has a lake, a stream, and boathouse, tropical greenhouse and potting shed, raised beds and carp pool, robot-mown lawn and a new wildflower meadow.

NEW Old Stable Barn

Gardens of an old farm building originally converted into a cottage 40 yrs ago. The style is that of a traditional walled cottage garden, and includes a recently renovated granary barn.

NEW No. 2. Turnpike Cottages

Traditional cottage garden with colour themed borders sheltered by an old pear tree. The wildlife meadows grow in colour and diversity each year. Also a small but productive greenhouse.

No. 1 Turnpike Cottages

A rose and clematis-filled cottage garden watched over by one of Froyle's famous statues. The back garden is also a productive potager, full of beautiful flowers, produce and surprises.

Welcome to Froyle Open Gardens

We hope you enjoy your visit to our lovely village and gardens. There is a lot to see. We have numbered the gardens 1 to 10 to make them easier to find. **Don't miss the two new gardens - one in Upper Froyle and one in Lower Froyle!**

Opening Hours

Gardens are open **1.30pm to 6pm** on **Saturday 7th** and **Sunday 8th June 2025**.

Car Parking

Lower Froyle parking is on the recreation ground next to the Village Hall, GU34 4LG. If you wish to visit the church in Upper Froyle, parking is in the field opposite, GU34 4LA. **Both car parks are locked at 6.30pm.** Parking for 1 and 2 Turnpike Cottages (Gardens 9 and 10) is on the service road outside, please park safely.

Tickets

Tickets are £10 each, cover all ten gardens, and are available at the Village Hall in Lower Froyle, and at Garden 10 in Upper Froyle, card and cash accepted. Your ticket is valid for both days in case you need more time. Children under 12 are free. **This guide is not a ticket!**

Toilets

Available at the Village Hall in Lower Froyle, including an accessible toilet.

Refreshments

Tea, coffee and delicious homemade cakes are available at the Village Hall from 2.30 to 5pm each day. You are also welcome to picnic on the recreation ground - not in the gardens please.

Dogs

Well-behaved dogs on a short lead welcome. Please pick up after your pooch.

Accessibility

Each map indicates suggested walking routes. Step-free gardens are shown on the map.

Safety Tips

Please take care walking in the lanes, they are open to traffic. Walking between Upper and Lower Froyle along the road is not recommended. In gardens, beware of steps, trip hazards and water areas. Due to visitor numbers, access to certain gardens may be limited at times.

Don't Miss!

Our Grade I listed St Mary's Church in Upper Froyle is open, with an exhibition of beautiful and historic 18th century vestments, from 1 to 6pm each day.

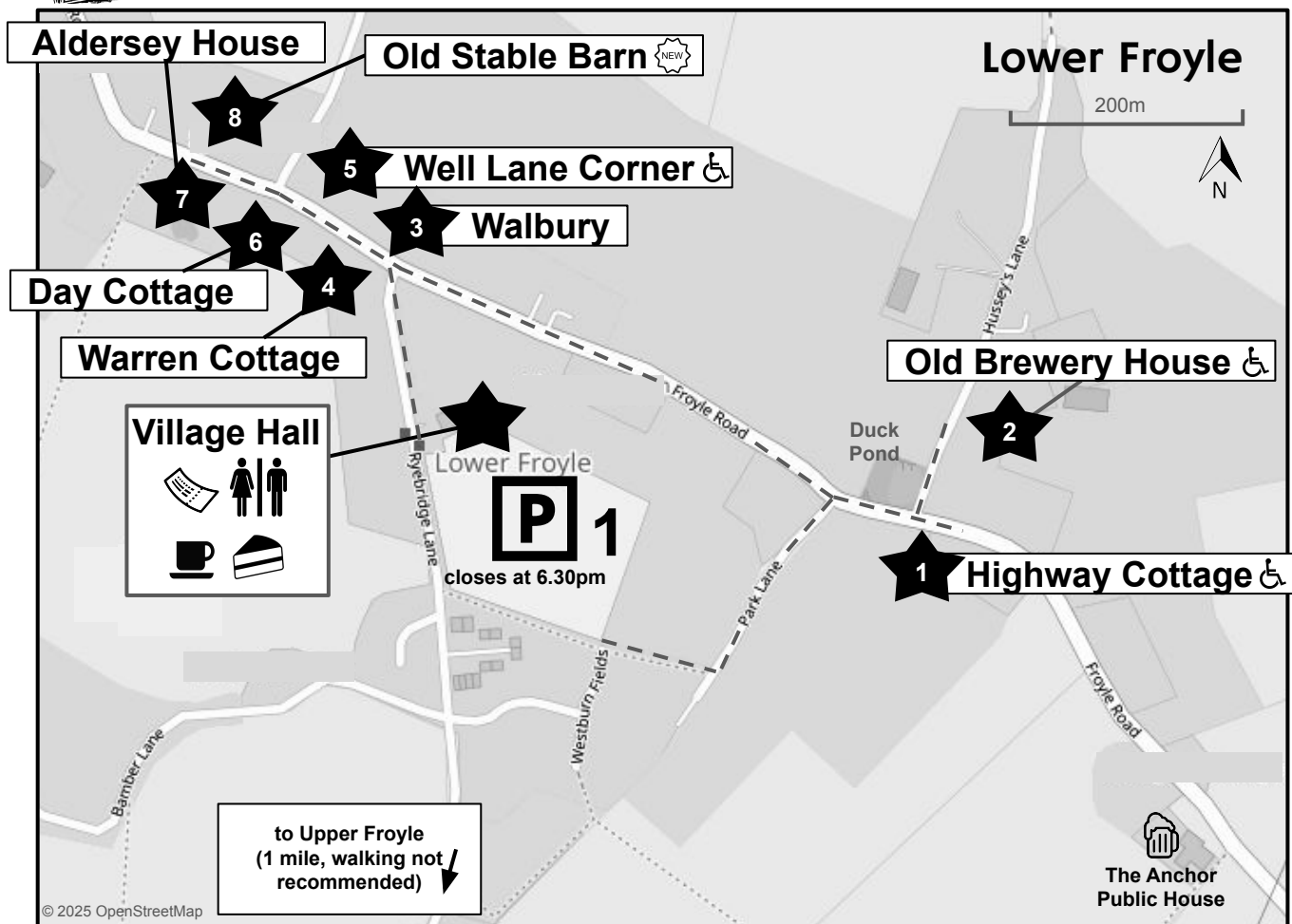

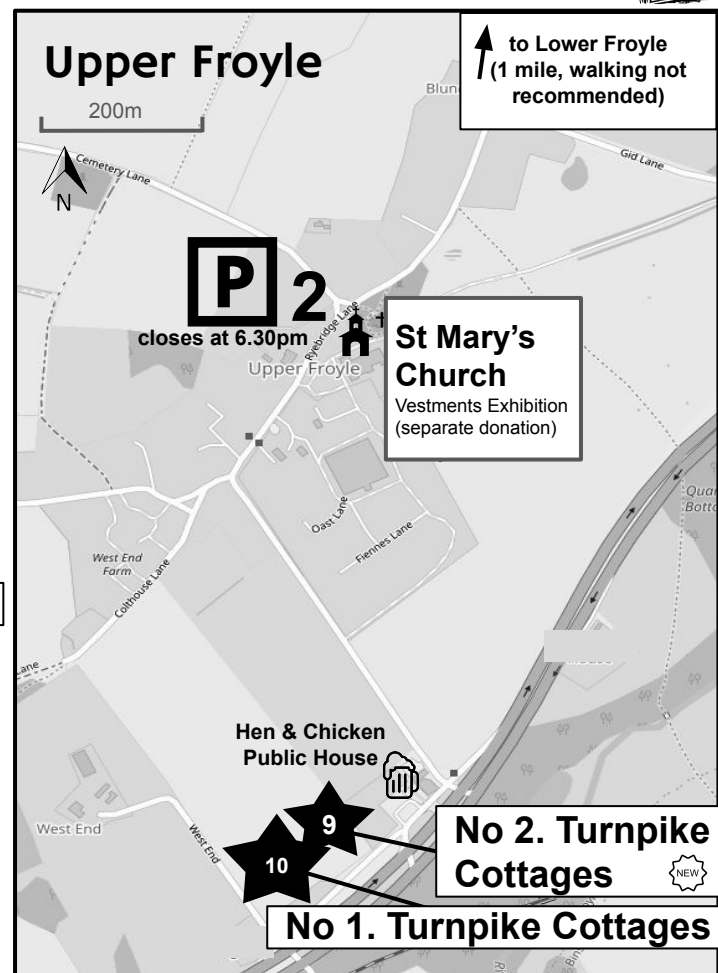


Froyle Open Gardens - Sat 7th & Sun 8th June 2025 - 1.30-6pm

- Free parking in Car Park P1 at the Village Hall - gate locked at 6.30pm
- Tickets - £10 each - available at the Village Hall
- Toilets including accessible toilets at Village Hall only
- Refreshments at Village Hall
- Step-free accessible garden
- NEW garden for 2025**
- No parking is available nearer the gardens
- Please take great care walking in the lanes, they are open to traffic
- - - Suggested walking route - total circular distance circa 2 km, 1.2 miles



In Upper Froyle

- Free parking for Church in Car Park P2 closes at 6.30pm - or outside the gardens
- Tickets - £10 each - at Garden 10
- Step-free accessible garden

- No toilets available in Upper Froyle
- Please take great care walking in the lanes, they are open to traffic
